Build Faster, Build Smarter: How Alternative Construction Methods Are Redefining What's Possible on Guam
PANEL DISCUSSION

With billions in defense investment flowing to Guam under the Pacific Deterrence Initiative, the Department of War has made clear that business as usual won't deliver at the speed the mission demands.

DAY 2

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Recent directives — from the November 2025 Warfighting Acquisition System reforms emphasizing speed-to-capability, commercial solutions, and Other Transaction authorities, to FY26 NDAA provisions targeting MILCON planning delays — are opening the door to construction methods once considered off-limits for federal work. This panel examines how alternative delivery is already reshaping projects on Guam and across the region: modular and industrialized construction, offsite prefabrication, 3D-printed concrete structures, mass timber, and accelerated and progressive design-build. Panelists will address what these methods mean in Guam's unique environment — typhoon and seismic loads, shipping and materials constraints, and a limited workforce — and share practical lessons on where they cut schedule and cost, where they don't, and what government and industry must do to scale them.

Regional Readiness: From One Guam to One Pacific Infrastructure Development Across the Second and Third Island Chains PANEL DISCUSSION

Indo-Pacific readiness does not stop at Guam's shoreline. Building from the "One Guam" approach — aligning military, government, industry, and community priorities inside and outside the fence — this panel explores how a broader regional understanding of security and readiness requirements must translate into coordinated infrastructure execution. As Guam continues to serve as a critical hub for Indo-Pacific operations, the larger question is how readiness extends beyond one island into a connected regional network across the Second and Third Island Chains — including the CNMI, Palau, the Federated States of Micronesia, the Republic of the Marshall Islands, and other Pacific partners.

This discussion will examine how readiness can be delivered across this regional network in a way that supports both mission requirements and long-term island resilience. What does the military need to achieve access, sustainment, dispersal, disaster response, and operational flexibility across the Pacific? Just as critical, what do local governments, agencies, utilities, communities, and the AEC industry need to plan, permit, fund, build, and maintain the infrastructure that supports mission readiness, local resilience, and long-term island security?

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This panel will also discuss the practical realities of execution: regional coordination, infrastructure gaps, inter-island logistics, supply chains, local capacity, workforce and housing constraints, federal investment, and the partnerships needed to build a stronger regional readiness network.

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1345-1430 Securing Cyber-Ready Infrastructure in the Indo-Pacific - CMMC, AI, and the Guam Defense Buildup
PANEL DISCUSSION

Recent changes to the Department of War's Cybersecurity Maturity Model Certification (CMMC) program have shifted the compliance landscape for defense contractors, pausing the planned Phase II rollout while reaffirming that cybersecurity remains a non-negotiable requirement across the Defense Industrial Base. For contractors supporting the Indo-Pacific—and especially Guam's rapidly expanding military infrastructure—the challenge is no longer simply preparing for a certification deadline, but building resilient cybersecurity programs that can adapt to evolving policy, AI-enabled threats, and mission demands.

This panel brings together leaders from industry and the Federal Government to discuss what the evolving CMMC framework means for contractors operating in a forward-deployed, infrastructure-constrained environment where submarine cable dependency, supply chain resilience, and civil-military coordination create cybersecurity challenges not typically addressed in mainland frameworks. Panelists will explore practical approaches to strengthening cyber resilience, preparing for future CMMC requirements, responsibly adopting AI, and protecting the critical infrastructure that underpins Indo-Pacific operations.

Attendees will leave with actionable insights on navigating an evolving regulatory environment while strengthening cybersecurity readiness for current and future defense missions.
